

Tuesdays With Morrie was the breakout New York Times bestselling book that captured the hearts of millions. The play, based on the book, follows the story of Mitch Albom and his visits with his former professor Morrie.

For fourteen Tuesdays he gathers wisdom and insight as he is taught life’s greatest lessons, ultimately transforming his life forever.

“The story is about death, which may typically leave the audience saddened. However, as we finish experiencing the story, we are left filled with love, light and hope.” said director Stephanie Kress. “As Morrie says in the play, ‘The truth is . . . once you learn how to die, you learn how to live.’ I am drawn to this, because simply, it is true.”

2022 Landscaping Project

The improvements to the Studio Stage Door will continue this summer with an exterior landscaping project that will also serve to prepare the section of ground to receive BUD'S BENCH when it is ready to be mounted.

A total landscape update will include new sod, trees, and shrubs with underground irrigation and new concrete sidewalks. Interior Seed & Fertilizer, a new retail store in Cranbrook, has offered to donate fertilizers and soil products towards the project.

Bud's Bench will complement the exterior appearance of the Heritage building.
